Separation of Powers

- The total powers of the gov't are divided between 3 branches
- This prevents one person or group from having too much power

• Separation of Powers

- The total powers of the gov't are divided between 3 branches
- This prevents one person or group from having TOO MUCH power
 - Legislative Makes Laws
 - Executive Enforces Laws
 - Judicial Interprets Laws
 - » Decides:
 - if someone has broken a law
 - If a law is constitutional

Limited Government

- Gov't cannot do anything it wants
- This prevents the gov't from abusing the citizens
 - Its powers are specifically listed in the constitution
 - Checks and Balances:
 - Each branch of Gov't can limit another branch
 - <u>Checks and Balances</u>: prevents one branch of government from becoming to powerful
- <u>Checks and Balances</u>: prevents one branch of government from becoming too powerful
 - Limited Gov't = Checks and Balances
- Federalism division of power between state & national gov't
 - Federalism Power Flows Down
- Popular Sovereignty
 - People have the power
 - Vote for Representatives
 - Vote for Laws
 - Popular Sovereignty

 - Representative Government
 - We elect officials to vote for us
- Representative Democracy or Republicanism
